




## Dear Members,

Team Australia: AustCham, the Australian Embassy, Austrade, and various other partner organisations continue to work as "Team Australia" to promote the Australia-Korea bilateral relationship. The group works well together in support of projects with various Australian Government Ministries, State offices and many other stakeholder organizations such as the Western Australia Korea Energy Resources Forum.

AustCham has participated in multiple interactions with a range of visitors including NSW Premier Mike Baird, MP Steve Ciobo and DFAT Secretary Peter Varghese providing perspective on business conditions in Korea as well as identifying opportunities for development of the relationship between Australia and Korea.

### **Supporting Education**

AustCham is a supporter of the University of Technology Sydney's Project "The Innovation Systems of Australia and Korea in the FTA Era: Deepening Linkages to Promote the Diffusion of Innovation" which has just recently been successful in its grant application for funding by the Australia-Korea Foundation. AustCham has proudly supported the New Colombo Plan (NCP) by offering business internships to successful Australian NCP recipients in 2016 within its Secretariat.

### **Issues Advocacy and Outreach**

AustCham participated in a forum at the request of HE Yoon Sang-jick, the Minister of Trade, Industry and Energy (MOTIE) and were invited to express our views on the directions and incentive programs that the Korean government offers the foreign business community. We also welcomed a trade mission from the Canberra Business Chamber and supported the Korea Agency for Saemangeum Development & Investment.

We have also continued to develop the relationship with Korea International Trade Association (KITA) and our recent joint KAFTA seminar was a great success. We continue to look for further similar opportunities.

We have also assisted in the pilot operation and later welcomed the launch of the Regulation Information Portal, a joint project by The Office for Government Policy Coordination (OPC), Ministry of Trade, Industry & Energy (MOTIE), and Korea Trade Promotion Corporation (KOTRA) to establish an online communications channel to actively hear out what foreigninvested firms have to say in the process of formulating legislations that regulate foreign-invested companies and of other regulatory information

AustCham continues to be active participant in the Seoul Metropolitan Government's Foreign Investment Advisory Council (FIAC) and recently developed a policy on the importance of contractual integrity.

### **Events & Community**

The heart and soul of AustCham are events and networking activities. AustCham kicked off the year with a great Australia Day at the Grand Hyatt Seoul, our regular Sundowners including a joint ANZAC Day Luncheon with the Kiwi Chamber - and continued to support our community by sponsoring the ANZA Ball. In addition, we took part in the Rugby World Cup Dinner with the British Chamber, Kiwi Chamber, and the newly formed South African Chamber
